As we draw our Christmas season to a close and begin a new secular calendar year, we would like to give you an update on how we are doing on our CMA appeal. We are **very grateful** for the 196 households that have contributed \$36,546 (as of 12/21/18) towards our goal of \$44,851. This is \$3,100 **less than** the same time last year. Our goal is down \$1,300 but this still leaves us \$8,205 short of our goal. *It is still possible for us to make our goal!* Your contributions help support our diocese in many ministries including the training and support it gives to our parish staff and it supports the work of Catholic Charities in Wayne County.

Siete Sabias Vinieron del Oriente a EE.UU. Hace 175 Años

No fueron tres sabios que llegaron del Oriente, sino hace 175 años, 21 de diciembre de 1843 llegaron a Pittsburgh desde Irlanda un grupo de siete mujeres religiosas de la congregación las Hermanas de la Misericordia. Bajo el liderazgo de Madre Frances Warde las Hermanas de la Misericordia llevaban sus regalos de educación, cuidado de salud, misericordia, compasión, etc. y los pusieron a los pies de los necesitados. Ellas abrieron escuelas y establecieron el primer hospital en la ciudad. Ellas vinieron para traer el mensaje de Jesucristo y para mejorar las situaciones de la gente. Llegando a un lugar nuevo las Hermanas siempre empezaban una escuela para los pobres y visitaron a los enfermos. Después de eso ellas empezaron a ver cómo fueron las personas en el lugar, cuáles fueron sus necesidades, y cómo pudieron responder a las necesidades.



La hambruna de papas en Irlanda fue la causa de la inmigración a los Estados Unidos empezando en 1845. Frances Warde era una amiga de Catalina McAuley quien fundó la congregación en 1831 y murió en 1841. Frances siguió el ejemplo de Catalina en los ministerios y llevó el mensaje de Cristo a los de la edad de escuela y a los enfermos y hospitalizados. Ese grupo de siete mujeres creció después. Ese grupo de siete se multiplicó siendo como 10,000, pero hoy somos 2,600 hermanas religiosas

en otras partes del mundo.

Continuamos intentando servir a los que están en más necesidad. El cuidado de salud sigue siendo importante y las hermanas sirven en seis sistemas de salud, y muchas otras facilidades como hospitales, centros de rehabilitación, cuidado de la salud de los enfermos. El acompañamiento de los inmigrantes, (los irlandeses al principio) y hoy de los inmigrantes que vienen a la frontera de los Estados Unidos ha sido importante siempre en los ministerios de mi congregación. Hacemos ministerio en Honduras, Panamá, Perú, Argentina, Chile, Guyana y Belize.

Hoy en día la fundadora es una inspiración a todas las Hermanas de la Misericordia e incluyo mí misma en eso. Parece que ella no está muerta. Tan frecuentemente nosotras hacemos referencia a ella. Una de nuestras Hermanas de Rochester, Hermana Mary Sullivan, ha investigado su vida y ha escrito libros sobre ella y es la autoridad más conocida sobre Catalina. La causa para la beatificación y canonización de Catalina McAuley está en el Vaticano ahora. La personalidad, carácter y motivación de Catalina inspiró a esas primeras hermanas que vinieron a este país. Catalina se enfocó en la vida de Jesucristo y ella frecuentemente decía que debemos intentar aparecer como Jesucristo en su misericordia.



Damos gracias a esas siete hermanas que vinieron en 1843. Empezaron en Pittsburgh y desde allí se creció el esfuerzo misionero. Frances Warde fundó muchas escuelas, hospitales, trabajos para ayudar a los necesitados y conventos nuevos en otras ciudades, uno de ellos siendo en Rochester en 1857.

Desde los esfuerzos de los siete, las Hermanas de la Misericordia hemos ido y hecho ministerios en muchas partes del país y del mundo. *Hermana Kay*

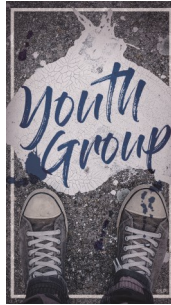
