Dios Nos Comunica por Usar Palabras

¿Cómo entendemos mejor el mensaje de otra persona? ¿Por señas o cántico o una foto o una pintura, o palabras...? Normalmente si podemos oír bien es por palabras que podemos explicarnos mejor. El mensaje de Dios se pone entendible por el lenguaje humano. Hoy en el evangelio Lucas escribe que ha decidido escribir sobre Jesús por orden para que otras puedan ver la verdad de lo que Jesús enseñó. Lucas había investigado intensamente para saber de y entender mejor lo que él no era testigo. ¡Qué regalo Lucas y los otros escritores de las Sagradas Escrituras nos han dado! En el pasado reunieron ciertos libros juntos en lo que llamamos la Biblia, una colección de 73 libros: 46 en el Antiguo Testamento y en el tiempo de Jesús son 27 en el Nuevo Testamento. No podemos aceptar literalmente todo lo que está escrito en la biblia. Muchos libros están incluidos en la biblia y hay una variedad de formas de literatura, por eso necesitamos saber cómo leer el libro según el tipo. Hay libros históricos y proféticos, libros de canciones, poesía, y de sabiduría, libros de evangelios, cartas, y de los tiempos finales. Tenemos que aprender interpretar y oír bien el mensaje de las Escrituras.

Contenida en las Escrituras es la historia de salvación, la historia de amor de Dios con su pueblo. Muchas personas han escrito de este amor a lo largo de los siglos. Los escritores con sus palabras inspiradas por el Espíritu Santo expresaban lo que experimentaban y vivían: que Dios llamaba a todos a la salvación; que a pesar de la infidelidad del pueblo a Dios, siempre había nuevas esperanzas de salvación; Dios quiere la vida de la persona y no su muerte. Los autores del Nuevo Testamento conocían el amor de Dios por todos en la vida, por la muerte de Jesucristo y en la historia de la Iglesia primitiva. Dios desea entablar un diálogo de amor con nosotros, pero a veces no oyemos la Palabra de Dios y no la llevamos a la práctica. Es un reto pasar más tiempo con las Escrituras, no leyéndolas rápidamente, sino despacio mientras que vamos meditándolas y viendo cómo se explican en el mundo de hoy y en la vida del individuo.

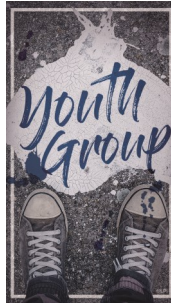

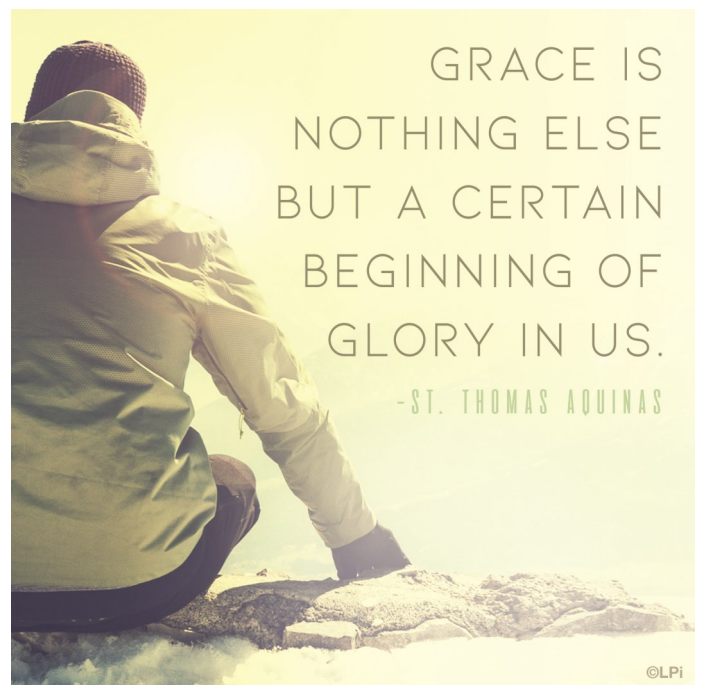

FAMILY MINISTRY

Jesus was the one sent by God to bring salvation to the world. Jesus announced that mission using the framework we hear in today's Gospel from the prophet Isaiah: glad tidings will be brought to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight for the blind, and freedom for the oppressed. Jesus inaugurates the Kingdom of God in his person—through his life, death, and Resurrection. We are charged with the task of continuing the mission that Jesus began. Jesus set the framework for all of us when he announced his ministry in today's Gospel. Jesus also gave us the helper we would need to enable us to participate in his mission. The Holy Spirit has been given to us so that we, the Church, might serve the Kingdom of God.

Gather with your family and suggest that they try to picture the vision that Jesus describes using the words of the prophet Isaiah as you read today's Gospel, Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21. Think about your neighborhood, your community. What are the situations and who are the people who most need to see this vision fulfilled? What steps would be necessary to make the vision a reality for them? Make a family commitment to pray for the Kingdom of God and to take a particular action that will address a need you see in your community. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you by praying the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.
