

We have a Holy Hour with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on the third Wednesday of each month from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. in the church. La Vida Tiene Mucho Valor vs. El Aborto

El nacimiento de un bebé es causa de alegría. Tan pequeño, tan hermoso, tan atrayente... Es difícil no mirarlo y admirarlo, de querer tomarlo en brazos y besarlo múltiple veces. Pero hay personas que dicen que está bien si algunas desean quitar la vida de los no nacidos, pensando que los fetos no son humanos. La Iglesia Católica ha condenado el aborto—quitando la vida de un bebé todavía no nacido. Los cristianos católicos creemos que toda vida es sagrada desde concepción hasta la muerte natural, y quitando la vida humana e inocente, es moralmente malo. La dignidad de la persona humana tiene su fundamento en el hecho de que fuimos creados por el amor de Dios y somos hechos en su imagen. El aborto va contra la dignidad humana y contra Dios.

El 25 de enero una ley nueva se aprobó en el estado de Nueva York. Esta ley (1) elimina el aborto del código penal del estado y lo coloca completamente dentro del ámbito de la ley de salud pública. (2) se expande quién puede realizar el procedimiento, más allá de solo médicos, a cualquier profesional de la salud autorizado y certificado para quien el aborto esté dentro de su ámbito de práctica. (3) legaliza el aborto después de 24 semanas en los casos en que se protegería la salud de una mujer o cuando un feto no es viable.

Algunos dicen que esta ley aplicaría también la expansión de charlas y repartición de anticonceptivos con libertad, así contribuyendo más al mal uso del sexo.

Aun al final del embarazo, en sus últimos tres meses, para

proteger la vida de la madre ahora el aborto es legal en este estado. Es permitido matar un bebé. Muchas veces las mujeres que han tenido abortos se quedan con la memoria de esto por años, y no solamente con el



recuerdo, sino con un sentido de culpabilidad por haber quitado la vida de un ser humano.

En nuestra diócesis hay un Proyecto Rachel que tiene el motivo de comunicarse con las mujeres que experimentan pena por la pérdida de un bebé por el aborto y ofrecerles la reconciliación y Hermana Kay
