### ¿Cómo Amamos Unos a Otros?

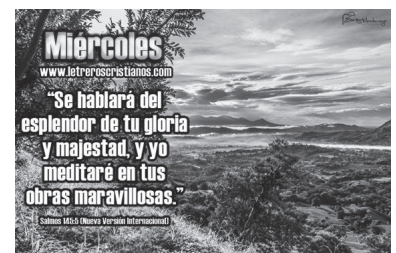
Jesús pide que amemos a otras personas como a sí mismo. Si hicieramos eso, estaríamos cumpliendo con los últimos seis mandamientos del Antiguo Testamento. El quinto mandamiento del Antiguo Testamento dice *no matar*. Bueno, ¿quién de nosotros va a asesinar a otra persona? Puede ser por el aborto, sí, pero la Iglesia también está contra de la pena capital y la guerra. Jesús dijo que "cualquiera que se enoje contra su hermano comete un delito." Debemos mirar nuestra condición interior; el enojo es violencia interior; el matar incluye la fría exclusión de una persona, el quitar por la lengua la reputación del otro, el abuso psicológico y físico, el ataque de otro por su falta de moralidad, y los pensamientos violentos. Para vivir este mandamiento positivamente tenemos que honrar la vida. Reemplace los pensamientos violentos con pensamientos amables hacia la otra persona. Fije la atención en el amor que que se siente en su vida y en la gratitud. Ore que Dios le ayude a vencer los hábitos violentos de pensamiento y emoción.

*No cometer adulterio* es más que estar sexualmente con otro que no es su pareja. Manteniéndose aferrado a malos deseos a una mujer o a un hombre es un pecado. El adulterio físico y las fantasías se incluyen en el sexto mandamiento. La violación interior corroe el matrimonio y a la vez deteriora la apertura personal a la presencia de Dios en su vida. En un matrimonio hay que tener confianza en su pareja de una forma digna y sincera. Podría violar la confianza en un matrimonio por atacar a su conyuge verbalmente, por pelear sexualmente, por manipular a su conyuge, por mentir uno al otro, por mantener rencor por detalles insignificantes y por desconfiar de su compañero. Hay que reemplazar todos estos sentimientos por sentimientos de aprecio y gratitud, dejando de violar la confianza, abriéndose a la honestidad, y tratando a su pareja con bondad. Hay que mirarse a su interior.

*No robar*. Mire a su interior para ver si robe; hay que reconocer y superar el hurto interior. A veces nos atribuimos el mérito de ideas que no son nuestras. Las dádivas que tenemos vienen de Dios y debemos reconocer que son para nuestro uso y placer. ¡Gloria a Dios por esos dones! En vez de quitar de otros su buena reputación hay que respetar al otro y reconocer su valor, dignidad y las dádivas que posee. A veces las leyes quitan de otros lo justo que merecen y la ayuda necesaria para vivir. En una sociedad en la cual todos piensan en sí mismos en vez del bien común, muchas veces estamos robando de los pobres. La creación es para todos, pero a veces corporaciones grandes toman la tierra, los bosques, lagos y ríos por su propio ganancia y no de todos. Eso es robo. Individualmente y en comunidad demos gracias a Dios por el aire que respiramos, la fe, la vida, los alimentos, las amistades, la familia, los placeres y las posesiones. *Hermana Kay*

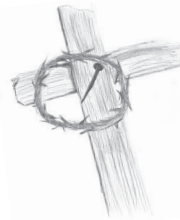

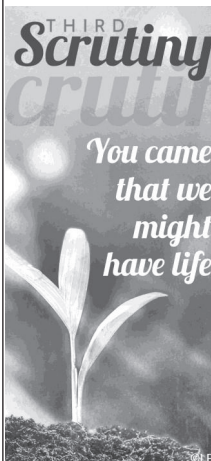
