Calles, Carreteras, Caminos

En este mundo moderno me parece que la mayoría de la gente desea subir a su auto y llegar a su destino rapidamente. Bueno, al escribir eso estoy diciendo que la gente tiene carros, tiene destino hacia se van, y desean llegar rapidamente. ¿Cómo podemos conectar esto con la vida espiritual?

Piensen en la idea de viajar. Si van a irse a Houston, Texas, supongo que no desean irse en un auto, sino en un avión. El viajar en carro va a durar dos días en el camino, usando las carreteras mas grandes, pero hay ventajas de esta manera de viajar. Es mas barato y uno ve las ciudades y pueblos en el camino; va a saber mejor la geografía del área y vas a encontrar a la gente del área. En el camino se come en un restaurante y compra gasolina donde puede conversar con personas que viven en el área; uno empieza a saber mas del área y de los que viven allá. Lentamente, al hacer preguntas, se forma un sentido del lugar, y llega a conocer el lugar no solamente por nombre sino por saber las dificultades y preocupaciones del pueblo.

Si uno no tiene una ruta determinada, se puede tomar calles sin número de ruta para poder ir en la dirección deseada y ver mas de acerca las partes rurales, las casas, método de agricultura y sus cultivos, vehículos y la vestidura de la gente del área. Se puede usar calles pavimentadas y los de piedras. ¡Qué bueno que podemos hacer esto, sin apurro, sin tener que llegar a un destino específico a una hora designado! Podemos conocer el área por irnos mas despacio. Podemos mirar y gozar y aun pararnos y apreciar una vista o un monumento o un museo o una plaza, iglesia, granja, campo de flores... Tantas veces tenemos tanto apurro que perdemos lo que Dios está ofreciéndonos en el camino. No es solamente el destino que tiene valor, sino todo entre de donde empezamos y a donde terminamos. Todo esto también nos habla y nos enseña. Muchas veces son estas sorpresas en el camino que nos enseñan mucho más. Podemos encontrar a Dios en el camino—esa persona que te ayuda con tanta paciencia y amor o esa vista tan gloriosa. Mantengan sus ojos abiertos y allí encontrará a Dios.

Así es en la vida espiritual—necesitamos tener paciencia sin desear llegar a un conocimiento de Dios muy rápidamente. Ese conocimiento podría ser mas superficial. Al tomar tiempo, tomando pasos pequeños se puede primero aprender de Dios por medio de sus padres, sus maestros, sus catequistas, los sacerdotes o religiosas, y después aprender de Dios por lo que otras personas y amigos comparten sobre su fe, la belleza de la creación, Dios, las Escrituras, etc. También puede compartir

sus dudas mientras está buscando avuda cuando se siente perdido en la fe u otras van burlándose de usted por su creencia en Dios. En el carro usamos un GPS o un mapa, pero en la vida espiritual usamos la dirección del Espíritu Santo junto con la ayuda

There are many ways in which we can compare the request for healing made by Jairus and the request of the

woman with the hemorrhage. One comparison helps us think about prayer. Jairus asked Jesus for healing on his daughter's behalf; the woman with the hemorrhage had no one to speak for her and bravely approached Jesus on her own initiative. In our prayers, we do both. We intercede for others' needs, and we also courageously express our own needs to God. We find hope in Jesus' response to both of these people, who sought him out in their hour of need. As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things you have prayed for this week. Notice that some of your prayers may have been for other people, and some of your prayers may have been for your own needs. In today's Gospel we find encouragement for both kinds of prayer. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 5:21-43. Talk about the similarities and differences between the two people who presented their needs to Jesus in this Gospel. Notice that both people received the healing they sought from Jesus. We want to pray for the needs of others and for our own needs with as much faith and hope as Jairus and the woman with the hemorrhage did. Pray together in thanks and praise to God, who hears our needs and answers them, by praying today's psalm, Psalm 30.




