¿De Dónde Viene la Sabiduría?

¿Alguien le ha pedido hacer algo, y usted piensa que le es imposible para usted hacer? A veces eso pasa; la persona pidiéndole ha visto algo en usted que le hace pensar que sí, usted tiene el temperamento, las cualidades o los talentos para poder hacerlo. Amós sintió la llamada de Dios para profetizar al pueblo Israel; estaba convencido que fue Dios que estaba pidiéndole hacerlo aunque el sacerdote de Betel no quería que él profetizara. También a veces los que necesitan escuchar consejo o una enseñanza no desean oírlo o recibirlo. Jesús mismo no fue aceptado en su propio pueblo porque fue reconocido como el hijo del carpintero y no como alguien especial que pudiera enseñarles.

A veces rechazamos el consejo o la enseñanza del otro porque él tiene menos educación o menos dinero que nosotros o es menor que nosotros o es un amigo de alguien que no nos cae bien. Puede ser que la recomendación del otro es valiosa pero resistimos seguirla por nuestros prejuicios. No queremos escuchar porque esa persona obviamente no va a tener algo bueno para compartir. Ya hemos juzgado antes de escuchar; nuestros oídos y corazones están cerrados. O a veces no queremos escuchar al otro porque pensamos que nosotros tenemos la razón y nadie va a cambiarnos nuestra opinión. Nosotros, los supuestos receptores, no recibimos. Es como en una familia cuando los padres les llaman a sus hijos para hacer un trabajito, los hijos no oyen a sus padres llamándoles, pero cuando es algo que los niños les gusta, responden inmediatamente.

¿Escucha la voz de Dios cuando El está pidiéndole hacer algo que le parece difícil? Sabe que Dios conoce sus capacidades, sus talentos y el tiempo que tiene, y va a estar a su lado ayudándole cumplir con lo que le pide de usted. Póngase en las manos de Dios. Jeremías no quería ser un profeta, pero lo hizo a pesar de cuestionar a Dios. Amós seguía profetizando aunque el sacerdote de Betel le pidió irse.

¿Qué hace usted cuando puede ver las injusticias en el mundo? ¿Responde por decir, "qué lastima?" ¿O actúa haciendo algo positivo en contra de la injusticia? Los profetas hablaban y actuaban contra las injusticias a pesar de las consecuencias. Jesús enseñaba y ponía en acción sus enseñanzas. El salmo de hoy empieza con "Voy a escuchar lo que dice el Señor." Necesitamos abrir nuestros oídos y corazones para vivir fielmente lo que Jesucristo desea que hagamos. Dios nos llama a ser cristianos verdaderos. ¿Va a pararse las orejas ante Dios en oración para saber lo que Dios quiere que sea y haga? ¿Va a escuchar el buen consejo de padres, maestros y amigos para saber más de Dios? Crezca en ser un buen receptor de los consejos de Dios. *Hna. Kay*

Family Ministry



Our family plays an important role in shaping us and forming our self-identity. In family life, we find a safe place to discover who we are and who God calls us to be. But sometimes the influences from outside our family can make us unrecognizable to those who know us best. These outside influences can lead us away from God, or they can lead us toward a deeper relationship with God. In today's Gospel, we see that the people of Nazareth could not recognize Jesus as the Son of God. They could know him only as the son of Mary. We hope that through our family life we will be encouraged to filter the many influences on our lives through the lens of faith so that we will become the person that God calls us to be. As you gather as a family, talk about the people and events that are influencing members of your family. Acknowledge that many of these people and events are positive influences, helping us be better people and leading us to a deeper relationship with God. Also acknowledge, however, that there are negative influences in our lives that risk pulling us away from God. Observe that Jesus was a person who allowed his relationship with God to be the most important thing in his life. This led many people to have faith in him as the Son of God. However, not everyone could recognize this about Jesus. Read today's Gospel, Mark 6:1-6. Ask: Who does not recognize Jesus as God's Son in this Gospel? (some of his kinfolk in Nazareth) Observe that because of the people's lack of faith, Jesus could not perform many miracles in Nazareth. Conclude by praying together that our families will continue to help us follow God in our lives. Pray together the Prayer for Vocations.

to be outside and enjoy Your creation.

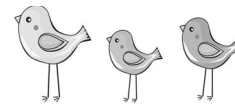
Thank You for the increased time
