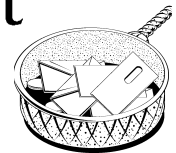

Puedo Imaginarme, Puedo Imaginarme

La imaginación es un don fantástico que hemos recibido. La cabeza puede llenarse de tantas imágenes y posibilidades. Quizás te has encontrado pensando, "si fuera así o si viviera en otro lugar o si tuviera otro tipo de educación o trabajo..." Después imaginamos cómo sería. Para creer en Dios Creador, necesitamos usar nuestra imaginación; tenemos un deseo de encontrarnos con Dios eterno. Con el paso de los años nuestras ideas de cómo es Dios cambian. En los evangelios Jesús, por contar parábolas, pedía a los oyentes usar su imaginación. Estaba comparando algo conocido con una realidad desconocido. Recientemente Dan Hennessy en el *Finger Lakes Times* escribió que la imaginación es lo que nos permite dejar la realidad física y explorar lo invisible. Podemos entrar a un mundo más grande que nuestros pies nos permiten y encontrar la maravilla de la creación y eventualmente el Creador mismo. San Juan escribe: "Después de esto miré y vi una puerta abierta en el cielo y la voz que antes había oído semejante a una trompeta me decía: 'Sube aquí y te mostraré lo que va a suceder en seguida.' En ese momento me tomó el Espíritu: vi un trono colocado en el cielo y alguien sentado en el trono (Rev. 4)." ¿Cómo serán nuestra resurrección y el cielo con Dios? Solo podemos imaginarnos.

Hay una canción llamada "Solo Puedo Imaginarme" (I Can Only Imagine) que fue escrito por Bart Millard en 1999 y de nuevo salió en 2001 vendiendo 2.5 millones de copias—la canción cristiana que se vendió más copias de todo tiempo. En marzo de este año apareció una película sobre Bart y cómo él llegó a escribir la canción para su band *Mercy Me*. Bart vivió una vida muy difícil porque su padre bebía mucho y fue muy agresivo y abusaba a su esposa, y cuando ella dejó la casa, el padre abusaba a Bart y nunca apoyaba a Bart, nunca lo ayudó a tener confianza en sí mismo. Después de la muerte de su padre, Bart escribió la canción porque vio un cambio tremendo en su padre cuando encontró a Dios casi al final de su vida. Bart dijo, "Mi padre fue un monstruo y yo vi a Dios transformarlo al hombre que yo quería ser y por eso escribí la canción."

Una parte de la canción:

Puedo imaginarme, Señor, cuando camino junto a ti.

Puedo imaginarme cuando te veré y tu rostro puedo contemplar. Puedo imaginarme.

Rodeado de tu gloria, ¿qué sentirá mi corazón?

¿Danzaré por ti, mi Cristo, o en silencio quedaré?

¿Estaré de pie en tu gloria o me tendré que arrodillar?

¿Cantaré aleluya o en silencio quedaré?

Puedo imaginarme. Puedo imaginarme.

Puedo imaginarme

el día que yo estaré junto al hijo de Dios.

Puedo imaginarme una eternidad

para siempre solo adorar.

Puedo imaginarme.

Family Ministry

Family demands can make us feel like Jesus and the twelve apostles. We wish for times of relaxation and renewal, but there are errands to do, household chores to keep up with, volunteer commitments to keep. These are all good things, but we can be left feeling drained and tired as we try to keep up. Perhaps we might take the opportunity this week to give ourselves permission to find the rest and relaxation that Jesus seeks for his disciples in today's Gospel. One of the gifts we can give to one another in our family life is assistance in finding the time and space to renew ourselves through prayer.

When you gather together as a family this week, bring your family calendar. Together review your family calendar and spend some time reflecting on your family activities. In particular, ask if your family has an appropriate amount of time for rest and relaxation. If not, discuss ways in which this time for renewal might be included in the week ahead. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 6:30-34. Notice how Jesus tried to find time and space for his disciples to rest and relax after they returned from their mission. Conclude in prayer together, asking God to help us find time to renew ourselves so that we might be better disciples of Jesus. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.
