#### Celebración Eucarística con un Misal Nuevo

¿Supieron que durante este mes hemos usado un Misal Romano nuevo? Por primera vez la Iglesia en los Estados Unidos tiene su propio Misal Romano para usar en Misas celebradas en español. Antes de esto hemos usado un Misal de México u otro país, pero ahora, teniendo mucho mas Latinos en el país, los obispos de la Iglesia de EE. UU. decidieron tener un misal en español para el pais, usando el texto oficial de México como la fuente. También hay algunos textos nuevos creados de los textos que son especiales para algunas de las celebraciones únicas de los Estados Unidos.

Al principio de julio Padre Jesús empezó a usar este misal nuevo en las Misas. Aunque en algunos áreas estaban usando "vosotros", nosotros estabamos usando "ustedes" en vez de "vosotros" y por eso no vamos a encontrar muchos cambios por parte del pueblo. Es el sacerdote que está encontrando cambios en las oraciones, por ejemplo las colectas y prefacios. También hay cambios en las oraciones Eucarísticas y otras partes del Misal. Hay un cambio que van a notar en una de las aclamaciones Eucarísticas. No vamos a responder con "Por tu cruz y resurrección nos has salvado, Señor." Esta respuesta ahora es: "Salvador del mundo, sálvanos, tú que nos has liberado por tu muerte y resurrección."

En cuanto los cantos en la Misa hay mas opciones para el sacerdote y el pueblo, y yo creo que poco a poco vamos a aprender mas. Favor de darme sugerencias de canciones que les gustaría incorporar en nuestras celebraciones. Tan importante es la música en nuestras celebraciones para dar gloria y alabanza a Dios y para reconocer nuestra posición frente a El.

Los cambios del Misal Romano son para ayudarnos celebrar mejor como comunidad. Hay que recordar que como comunidad de creyentes estamos reunidos a vivir la presencia compartida de Dios y estar presente uno al otro físicamente. Amistad y presencia alrededor de una mesa en el tiempo de Jesús fue muy importante, y ahora en nuestra celebración Eucarística es también importante. Con quienes compartimos la mesa y cómo nos relacionamos con otras personas indican como es nuestra comunidad. ¿Nos quedamos con los conocidos o los del mismo origen o nos abremos a todos? Pido que participen activamente por acoger a los demás con mucha hospitalidad para que verdaderamente formemos una comunidad de amor y de hermanos

(as) en Cristo.
Cantemos y respondamos a los saludos del sacerdote y las terminaciones de oraciones. Debemos poder oír a todos responder en oración y canción. No es un tiempo solamente de oír. Hermana Kay

# Family Ministry



In today's Gospel, the crowd asks Jesus for a sign so that they can believe that he has come from God. This is a curious request, because Jesus has just fed more than 5000 people with just five barley loaves and two fish. How quickly they seem to have forgotten the wonderful thing that Jesus has done for them. Or, maybe they never recognized the miracle in the first place. Sometimes we don't recognize the wonderful things that God has done for us. And, sometimes, we simply forget and ask for further evidence of his love and care. We pray that God will remove our blindness so that we can receive with thanks and praise all the wonderful things that God accomplishes in our lives.

Together as a family, name the wonderful gifts that God has given you and some of the remarkable deeds that God has accomplished in our world. Observe that it is important to stop to count our blessings because we can easily miss recognizing all of the wonderful things that God does for us. Read together today's Gospel, John 6:24–35. Ask: Why are the people seeking out Jesus? (because he has fed them) What do they want from Jesus? (a sign that he has come from God) What does Jesus tell them? (He says that he will give them something greater and more important than the bread that fed their physical hungers; he will give them bread that will give them eternal life.) Recall that we have this gift from Jesus in the Eucharist. Pray together, thanking God for all that he has given to us, especially for the gift of eternal life and the Eucharist. Pray together the Magnificat.
