Wayne County Pastoral Planning Update August 2018

Where are we with pastoral planning?

The members of the Wayne County Planning Team continue to work on the formation of recommendations to address the areas requested by Bishop Matano.

Please visit oprp.dor.org and click the "Active Pastoral Planning Groups" tab to follow all of the updates and information. Which configuration scenario was chosen for recommendation by the team?

At our July meeting, the team unanimously chose to recommend the configuration scenario of 2 Pastors and 2 Parochial Vicars, which clusters SKD and SMK; and also clusters CCBT, SJW, and SM. Deacon Bob Lee sent our recommendation on to Bishop Matano on July 19, and on July 23rd we received a favorable reply, with the next step being a presentation to the Presbyteral Council in September. Deacon Lee's letter, detailing the benefits and challenges of this scenario, as well as the Bishop's reply can be found on the Diocesan Pastoral Resources and Planning website.

What's Next?

In his response to the planning team the Bishop has suggested the team may continue working on our recommendations for Mass schedules, human resources (paid and volunteer), and building infrastructure. Our work on recommendations will continue through the winter. Once we have made our recommendations, implementation (including *when* to implement) regarding Pastor and Parochial Vicar assignments will be determined by the Bishop and the Priest Personnel Board, in conversation with priests and in light of needs across the diocese.

The surveys completed in June as well as the data collected from each of the five parishes will be used to guide the planning team as we move forward with these most important recommendations. The surveys are now up on the diocesan website by region. Thank you for your continued support as we navigate this most important process!

V Encuentro del Ministerio Hispano/Latino

Hay cambios grandes dentro de la Iglesia católica en los Estados Unidos. En un artículo Hosffman Ospino nota que es importante entender las transiciones en las vidas de las comunidades de fe en los Estados Unidos. Como 70 años atrás 90% de los Católicos en este país fueron blancos y euro-americanos. La mayoría fueron descendientes de inmigrantes de Europa Occidental. La mayoría de ellos ya estaban integrados en la cultura mayor de EE.UU. Muchos recibieron los beneficios de una educación Católica y las voces de los que pertenecían a la clase media tenían influencia. 25% de la población fue Católico, y las parroquias tenían ministerios para responder a la cultura de ellos.

Hubo una lucha social y económica para ellos, especialmente los que vivían en el campo y la ciudad, y frecuentemente las minorías raciales y étnicas son la razón por el crecimiento de la población católica. 71% del crecimiento Católico en el país daurante estos 70 años es la población hispana. 43% de la población católica es latina. Como 60% de los católicos menos de 18 años son latinos.

Tenemos que considerar cómo recibimos la bendición de catolicismo latino y cómo acompañamos a los latinos para que crezcan en su fe. Desde el año pasado hemos participado en el proceso del V Encuentro del ministero latino. Las reuniones de grupos, parroquias, dióceses y regiones durante estos dos años son para ayudarnos a consultar, evangelizar y planificar actividades misioneras. Hemos podido ver mejor nuestras realidades pastorales y las necesidades del pueblo latino. El **próximo paso** es cuando como 3,000 representantes de las dióceses se reunen en Grapevine, Texas el 20-23 de septiembre por la reunión nacional. Los representantes entrarán en diálogo, escuchando esperanzas y sueños de los de las periférias de la sociedad y cómo podemos llegar mejor a ellas. Habrá oportunidad de aprender las mejores prácticas sobre el discipulado misionero y el futuro del ministerio hispano, con énfasis en la pastoral con jóvenes y familias. Después de juntar todo aprendido durante el proceso se espera ganar algunas nuevas percepciones

y conclusiones para llevar a las parroquias y dióceses y usarlas para hacer mas planificación pastoral.

Todo este proceso es para ayudar a la Iglesia completa para comprometerse a servir a esta población. Se espera que los latinos puedan responder mejor como discípulos misioneros y como



líderes al servicio de toda la Iglesia y la sociedad.
