Hands of Christ: The Hands of Christ is a recognition program of the Diocese of Rochester which helps to assist parishes in affirming their high school seniors who have been the "Hands of Christ" in their church, home, school and community; it is sponsored by the Department of Evangelization and Catechesis. Our nomination process has changed, so if you would like to nominate a 2019 graduating senior for this award, please call the parish center and speak with June Sherman or Katie Childs. June or Katie will ask you why you think this senior should be chosen for this award, the senior will then be contacted by a letter explaining the award. Any youth nominated will be asked to write an essay about why they feel they should be considered for this recognition.

All nominations need to be communicated to June Sherman or Katie Childs by October 12, 2018. Nominations will not be accepted after this date, as we have to contact the youth and give them time to write their essays.

After all essays are received, the parish staff will decide on the recipients of the award.

Please keep in mind the following criteria for someone to receive this award:

- Has **consistently** demonstrated a Christian attitude by word and example.
- Has been **actively involved** in the parish as well as their school or community.
- Has been a **positive role model** to their peers, younger children and adults.
- Is a **practicing Roman Catholic** in a parish in the Diocese of Rochester and attends Mass.
- Is currently a **high school senior**.

FAMILY MINISTRY

The second part of today's Gospel contains a strong message for those who share the responsibility of fostering faith. It is indeed an awesome responsibility. Today's Gospel reminds us that faith is a lifelong journey toward God. We don't always get it all or even get it right. But we pray for the grace to acknowledge and build upon even the smallest signs of faith, in ourselves and in others. There are plenty of obstacles that might prevent the growth of faith. Let us pray that we are not contributing to the obstacles that might hinder another person's faith in Jesus.

As you gather as a family, observe that there are things in our lives that nurture our faith and things that can hinder it. Talk about some of the things that nurture our faith—healthy family relationships, healthy friendships, good literature, and so on. Name some of the things that might be an obstacle to faith—unhealthy relationships, scandals, and so on. Observe that Jesus teaches us in today's Gospel that we are to do everything we can to help one another have faith in Jesus and do all that we can to avoid creating obstacles that might hinder another person's faith. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48. Conclude by praying together that we will be a family that helps each other grow in faith. Pray together today's psalm, Psalm 19, or the Lord's Prayer.
