¿Qué pide Dios de nosotros porque somos bautizados? Por medio del sacramento de Bautismo seguimos a Jesús. ¿Cómo lo seguimos? Descubrimos en los evangelios cómo es Jesús. Son las cualidades de Jesús en los evangelios que debemos intentar vivir en nuestras vidas. Jesús muestra compasión hacia otras personas; él toma tiempo con otras escuchándoles. It is a choice we can make with the awareness that our faith in Jesus commits us to show our care for the poor.

As you gather as a family, consider together these questions: Would it be possible to inventory our possessions? Are there things in our house that we no longer need or use? What might we do with these things? Read together today's Gospel, Mark 10:17-30. Talk about the warning about material possessions

that Jesus gives in this Gospel. How does this make you feel? Choose an action that helps your family show its commitment to the poor. Conclude by praying together the <u>Peace</u> Prayer of Saint Francis.


