DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER PERMANENT DIACONATE: The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church. The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at edward.giblin@dor.org, for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate.

Es la misma María, pero la gente se acerca a ella por medio del título e historia de ella en su país. María así pertenece más a ellos. Dulce nombre de Jesús es celebrado en algunas partes de México. El Niño Dios es venerado en algunas partes, y la imagen está llevado en procesión y hay rezos y cantos que acompañan esto.



Hay procesiones en muchas partes de nuestros continentes por la traslación del Santísimo, el Vía Crucis, santos y patrones. Al ir en procesión uno puede caminar con Cristo en el camino de la vida.

Peculiar en México es el culto a los muertos y las ceremonias y rituales que tienen que ver con la muerte y su conmemoración. En otras partes la comunidad se reúne para orar

con la familia de un muerto por nueve días después del entierro. En esto existe la oportunidad para evangelizar uniendo la muerte del ser querido con la muerte de Cristo.

Muchas veces el pueblo puede recibir apoyo a su fe con estas ex-

presiones de fe y devoción y por eso la Iglesia acepta ambos: las expresiones de fe oficiales y estas expresiones populares que también pueden nutrir la fe. Pero siempre tenemos que acompañar estas expresiones populares con la parte pastoral y la evangelización. Tan importante es que la gente aprecie a Cristo presente en la
