

Wayne County Pastoral Planning **October Update**



Proposed Mass Schedules

The members of the Wayne County Planning Team continue to work on the formation of recommendations to address the areas requested by Bishop Matano. Please visit oprp.dor.org and click the "Active Pastoral Planning Groups" tab to follow all of the updates and information.

Since our last update we have received the approval of our diocesan Presbyteral Council for our clustering scenario of 2 Pastors and 2 Parochial Vicars, which clusters SKD and SMK; and also clusters CCBT, SJW, and SM.

Since then we have been evaluating ministries and needs through a review of the survey completed by 341 parishioners from across the county. The latest part of our work has been on developing a proposed Mass schedule. As you might imagine, this has been a difficult task. We are now ready to present to our parishioners three possible Mass schedules for feedback before the Planning Team makes a final *recommendation*. We have one opportunity left for you to hear the proposed schedules and give feedback.

It is important to know that while we are working on this schedule now, we do not know when it will be implemented. We are developing this plan now so we can spend the proper amount of time on it. Advent: Preparing for the Incarnation Another Presentation by Fr. Jeff

When people hear the word "advent" in a religious setting, the first thing that often comes to mind is Christmas. "Incarnation" is the word we use to speak of how Jesus, who was and is fully divine became human just like us. We are called to go deeper and think about what the Incarnation means for us. Advent can be a time for this. We invite you to come to this presentation as Fr. Jeff helps us explore the significance of Advent and the Incarnation on Wednesday, November 28th at 7:00 p.m. in the parish hall.



Rito de Comunión: la Procesión Comunitaria

Jesucristo se nos da en Comunión bajo dos especies: su Cuerpo y su Sangre. Recibimos Cristo como él se había entregado a sus discípulos el Jueves Santo: su Cuerpo y su Sangre bajo las apariencias de pan y vino, y de nuevo el Viernes Santo se nos dio totalmente por su cuerpo desgastado. Es este Jesucristo que recibimos en la Comunión que nos alimenta y nos da la fuerza para seguir adelante y actuar como un cristiano Católico.

En este Rito de Comunión los miembros de la asamblea van adelante en una acción audaz de comer de su Cuerpo y beber de su Sangre. Están moviendo hacia adelante para participar en el Misterio Pascual, para dar sus vidas con y para los demás en este misterio de la Cruz y la Resurrección para que puedan continuar la misión de redención de Cristo. Nuestra celebración de la Eucaristía no termina a la puerta de la iglesia, porque al salir de la iglesia debemos seguir a Cristo y actuar como Cristo.

Todos vamos adelante en esta procesión: niños, mayores, adultos, jóvenes, pobres, ricos, enfermos, distintos géneros, discapacitados, personas de distintos países. Todos buscamos el alimento espiritual de Cristo, y todos somos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo. Todos debemos estar orando por medio de la música, cantando juntos en comunidad.

Quizás cuando éramos niños aprendimos que debemos caminar adelante en oración y silencio, recibir la Comunión y volver al asiento y orar arrodillados. Pero no es así hoy en día. Debemos cantar y el cantar en la Misa es siempre oración. Para participar plenamente implica que estamos conscientes del significado de la canción. Prestamos atención a las palabras que estamos cantando. Por el cántico de la Comunión expresamos nuestra unión uno con el otro en espíritu por la unidad de nuestras voces. El cantar puede darnos más alegría del corazón y al mismo tiempo este rito es oración de la comunidad—juntos cantando de esa alegría. Somos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo y se cumple esa idea por alimentarnos con el mismo Cuerpo y Sangre. Podemos sentirnos más unidos y puede ser como una comunidad que po-

demos hacer juntos unas acciones para poner en acción la Palabra del día.

Cuando comulga, hágalo bajo las dos especies, recibiendo el alimento completo del Cuerpo y de la Sangre de Cristo. Juntos formamos la Iglesia y juntos cre-



cemos en el amor y conocimiento de Cristo.
