### Luz para las Naciones—Sí, Usted Es.

Somos la Iglesia y hemos sido bautizados no solamente para ser la iglesia, sino para salir de la iglesia, el edificio donde tenemos el culto los domingos y compartir lo que debemos ser como Católicos. Debemos ir al mundo, pero muchas veces hay desacuerdo entre nosotros, especialmente sobre sexo y autoridad. Necesitamos ver cuán afortunados somos para haber recibido la luz de Cristo. Dios no nos creó por una necesidad de Dios, sino para compartir su gloria. ¿Puede sentir ese amor de Dios? Hemos sido amados a entrar nuestra existencia. Dios desea nuestro bien; Dios crea desde nada; Dios habla el mundo a tener existencia.

En el Sermón en el Monte Jesús nos dice que debemos amar nuestros enemigos. Estamos conectados uno al otro; estamos conectados más profundamente que algo puede dividirnos. Esa gracia es la fundación de nuestra fe. ¿Cómo puede usted permitir existir el odio, la violencia, la crítica, el racismo, los prejuicios, la envidia, el rechazo...?

¿Se acuerda de Elías pidiendo a la viuda hacerle un pan aunque ella tenía poco? La lección: Entrega la vida y va a recibir más vida. Al pecar entramos en un vacío grande. Demasiadas veces pensamos en nosotros mismos y nuestros deseos no más, y no en los demás.

Jesús llegó a nuestro mundo y reunió algunos discípulos alrededor de él. El invitó a todo tipo de persona a estar en su mesa (aun todos nosotros). Dios en el Antiguo Testamento se puso enojado cuando la gente no hacía lo que quería. Él quería poner todo correcto. Jesús también quería poner cosas en su lugar; él limpió el templo para que fuera un lugar de culto y no de comercio. Jesús no fue un guerrero con armamentos, sino un hombre de paz y no violencia y quería conquistar a sus enemigos por el amor no violento. Jesús perdonó a todos y respondió por un amor de perdón a la violencia contra él en la tortura y la muerte en la cruz. Jesús, no un líder de los judíos o de los romanos, fue el Señor. Él resucitó; fue Él la luz para todos.

Tenemos que compartir esta historia de Jesús y el mensaje de Jesús con todos con quienes tenemos contacto. Hoy nosotros somos la luz para las naciones y eso significa que debemos trabajar a cambiar nuestra cultura, transformándola para que siga los valores del evangelio. Tenemos que estar animados por nuestra historia de fe y compartir ese entusiasmo. Deje la luz de nuestra fe arder en usted y después transmita ese ardor a otras.

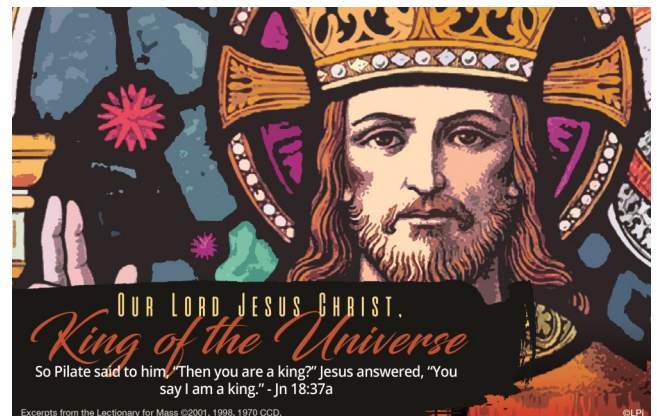
