Catholic Ministries Appeal - "Sharing Our Blessings"





Third Sunday Of Advent

Adviento: un Tiempo de Espera Gozosa

¡Alegría! ¡Adviento! Aquí estamos esperando. Nuestro uso de la corona de Adviento nos hace pensar en esperar. Primero una vela—cuatro semanas; 2 velas—tres semanas nos quedan; 3 velas—dos semanas más para esperar; 4 velas—una semana más, y este año podemos decir solamente dos días más. Hemos tenido buenas experiencias de Navidad en el pasado y eso se hace más fácil la espera. El Papa Francisco habló de Adviento cuando él dijo que nosotros cristianos somos llamados a proteger y extender la alegría de esperar: esperamos a Dios quien nos ama y a la vez Dios nos espera a nosotros. Adviento debe ser un tiempo de novedad consoladora y espera alegre.

La vida es llena de miedos: miedo del otro, miedo de la violencia, miedo de no estar aceptado, miedo del fracaso, miedo de que no podemos cambiar el mundo, miedo de no encontrar un trabajo, miedo de perder su pareja... A veces personas no actúan porque tienen estos miedos, pero nuestro Señor Jesucristo nos invita a pararnos, a mirar de donde El vendrá. Somos hijas e hijos de Dios y no de fracaso y miedo. El evangelio viene de Dios y es Dios que viene y nos anima a dejar atrás la comodidad que nos hace perezosos. Necesitamos pensar en quien nos ayuda a perder el miedo y actuar.

Ese es Jesús de Belén; ese es el niño en el pesebre; ese es el niño a quien los tres sabios reyes habían llevado regalos; es Jesús, hijo del carpintero y María; es Jesús de Nazaret; es El que nos ama diariamente y nos invita a actuar y ayudar a los demás. Es ese Jesús que vino hace tantos años a nuestro mundo y sigue estando con nosotros recordándonos de su presencia y ayuda.


