

As we draw our Christmas season to a close and begin a new secular calendar year, we would like to give you an update on how we are doing on our CMA appeal. We are **very grateful** for the 218 households that have contributed \$40,085 (as of 12/27/17) towards our goal of \$46,195. This is \$213 **less than** the same time last year. **Riesgo y Determinación en este Año Nuevo**

Al principio de cada año pensamos en cómo vamos a cambiar nuestra vida para mejorarla. Pensamos que es importante hacer unas resoluciones para mejorar nuestras vidas. Un problema es que decidimos lo que queremos lograr sin consultar el Espíritu Santo. Pensamos que es tiempo de cambiar, por eso nosotros mismos decidimos hacer el esfuerzo para lograr el cambio. Olvidamos pedir a Dios ayudarnos. Sí, tomamos una acción, pero olvidamos la parte de fe: "Dios, si tú deseas que yo logre esto, esté conmigo, quédate conmigo. Sea mi Luz en el camino, y animame cuando empiezo con la flojera en el camino. Sé que yo puedo mejorarme, pero a veces tengo mis dudas y dejo el camino de mejoramiento." Tiene que admitir su debilidad y la necesidad de Dios en su vida. Tiene que ir en una dirección derecha, desarrollando hábitos buenos y positivos para el cambio de vida. Quizás vacilamos a hacer la decisión pensando que no podemos lograr nuestra visión de un cambio.

Cada mañana pedimos la ayuda de Dios, y durante el día hacemos los intentos de actuar de una manera que nos ayuda lograr el cambio deseado. En la noche reflexionamos sobre nuestro día para ver si seguimos el camino. En la noche podemos decir, "Voy a intentar de nuevo mañana." No podemos lograr algo grande de un golpe, pero por hacer cosas pequeñas que son parte de nuestra visión, eventualmente podemos lograr la visión más amplia. Con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo podemos hacer cosas que no queremos hacer, por ejemplo: hacer una llamada, decir, "lo siento," visitar a un enfermo, escribir una nota por e-mail o mensaje texto...

Estamos en este mundo no solamente para existir, sino para darnos por el bien del mundo. No estamos aquí en el mundo solamente para comer, ganar dinero, dormir, mirar el teléfono y ver la televisión. Realmente queremos lo que pasa a otras personas?

Algunas personas dicen que debemos desarrollar algunos ritos sencillos que son acciones pequeñas que logran el cambio más grande. ¿Dice usted por ninguna ocasión especial a su esposo(a) en el medio del día o en la noche que le ama? ¿Toma tiempo para conversar con sus hijos aunque esté cansado? Sigue con muchas acciones constantes que son ayudas para lograr el cambio, y nunca piensa que ya ha logrado la visión o el cambio. ¿Sus relaciones con otras personas están basadas en el amor?

Otro área de cambio puede ser su vida espiritual. ¿Está orando cada día? ¿Está dedicando un tiempo para reflexión bíblica? ¿Está leyendo un libro espiritual? ¿Su relación con Dios está profundizándose? Espero que durante 2018 usted crezca en el amor hacia Dios y los demás.

## Family Ministry

The tradition of giving gifts at Christmas is thought by some to be rooted in the gift giving of the Magi. In many cultures, gifts are not exchanged at Christmas, but rather on the feast of the Epiphany. Whenever you exchange your Christmas gifts, take some time to reflect on this tradition of gift giving at Christmas. Think of the best gift you have received. What was it? What made it special? Was it the gift itself, the thought that went into it, or the person who gave it to you?

Read today's Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12. The gifts of the Magi—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—have come to be understood as symbols of Christ's royalty, divinity, and eventual suffering and death. They are special because in giving them, the Magi acknowledge who Jesus was to be: our Savior. We pray that we will acknowledge Jesus as Savior in all that we do and say. Conclude by singing together "We Three Kings."
