Padres de Familia Aman y Guían

Hoy es un día especial para los padres de familia—los que tienen hijos, nietos y bisnietos. Recientemente yo estaba hablando con alguien sobre cómo su padre actuaba en la casa que él no levantaba la voz en casa. Al pensarlo, no recuerdo un tiempo cuando mi propio padre levantó la voz. Pero he estado en casa ajena cuando el padre estaba gritando a sus hijos. La voz usada así no enseña al hijo cómo actuar con otros. Son los padres que supestamente deben enseñar a sus hijos por palabra y acción cómo actuar. El padre no debe dominar; tiene que respetar al hijo y no aplastarlo con gritos. La persona aplastada no va a prestar atención a la voz del otro cuyo pie está encima de uno.

Siendo un padre no es fácil porque se necesita mucha paciencia y gracia. El padre no es un dictador ni un jefe. El padre debe estar al lado de su esposa para compartir todo: las alegrias, los dolores, el trabajo dificil, la esperanza, el amor y una fe firme. El está presente en el hogar junto a su esposa tomando parte en las vidas de sus hijos—cuando los hijos juegan, estudian, cuando están tristes, alegres, miedosos, cuando han salido del buen camino y cuando han vuelto al camino derecho. El padre no controla a sus hijos; eso quita de los hijos el oxígeno necesario para desarrollarse como individuos únicos. Los hijos deben desarrollarse individualmente con sus propios talentos; los hijos no son copias de sus padres.

Al disciplinar a sus hijos, el padre no debe degradar a sus hijos, ni debe permitir a sus hijos hacer lo que quieren. El padre que ama a sus hijos necesita ser firme en corregir al hijo, manteniendo su dignidad y la del hijo, y a la vez necesita esperar con paciencia los cambios en los hijos. Los hijos van a aprender mucho por las acciones de sus padres. Padres, que construyan en sus casas hogares de paz, que respeten a sus esposas y a sus hijos para que haya una comunicación libre y un ambiente donde cada miembro de la familia puede abrirse, ser acogido y apreciado sin juicios, presiones y desprecios. Respeten la dignidad y el valor de cada uno. Muestren su amor y afecto hacia los

Acuérdense siempre a orar para formar una relación íntima con Dios para que Dios les ayude en su propia vida y oren para poder tener los dones necesarios para guiar bien a sus hijos. Para fomentar la paz en la familia hay que invitar a Dios para que sea la base de su familia. Padres, no se olviden que Dios también es su compañero en amar, guiar y transmitir tu fe y valores a sus hijos. Compartan en familia la oración como familia, la Palabra de Dios, y la Eucaristía cada domingo. Gracias por aceptar el regalo de ser padre de familia y por la responsabilidad que es incluída en eso.

Family Ministry

Church documents call the Christian family the "domestic church." This is both a compliment and a call to commitment. Because the family is a community formed in love and dedicated to the physical and spiritual growth of its members, it is a miniature version of the Kingdom of God on earth. This Sunday's Gospel Reading, Mark 4:26-34, consists of two parables that Jesus used to help us discern the mystery of the Kingdom of God. The beginning of the kingdom is compared to a tiny seed that over time matures and ripens. Many of the things we do within the family seem insignificant. They are part of our daily activity and attract little attention. Yet they show our love and concern for one another. According to the Gospel, it's these small things that yield big results, acting as significant contributions to the growth of God's kingdom on earth. The growth of the seed illustrates the nature and the results of a strong faith. Read aloud together the Gospel of Mark 4:26–34. Consider how your family's concerns reflect the Church's concerns for those members who are poor, forgotten, hungry, ill, shunned, or lonely. Together think of a specific action that you can do to assist a person in your extended family, neighborhood, or parish. Now pray together the Lord's Prayer, pausing briefly to consider the import of the words "thy kingdom come." Each evening this week as you gather for supper, share with one another the simple acts of love you witnessed within the family that day.
