Please Note: <u>No</u> Popular/Secular Tape or CD Music is allowed during the service. This music can be used at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon.

Placing of the Pall: family members may place the large cloth (pall) that is used to cover the casket at the beginning of the funeral, the pall symbolizes the baptismal garments. Consult your Funeral Director about this.

- Placing of a Christian symbol on the casket. *Once the pall is placed the family is invited to place on top of the casket a crucifix that may have hung in the home, or a rosary or bible.* The Christian symbol is meant to be an object that reminds us of our faith and devotion and the devotion of the loved one we gather around.
- Proclaiming the readings during the funeral mass. Those who read the Scriptures, *must be fully initiated* (*Received the Sacrament of Confirmation*) in the Catholic Church and practicing their faith. The texts for the Old Testament and New Testament will be on the pulpit and the Pastoral Associate will accompany the reader to the pulpit. The Pastoral Associate may proclaim these readings.
- Words of Remembrance: If offered, these **very brief** comments can be shared after communion. They are not to exceed 5-6 minutes and must be typewritten. These words at church are meant to reflect the deceased life of faith. These words should speak of how they lived their faith, inspired us and deepened our faith through his or her life on earth.
