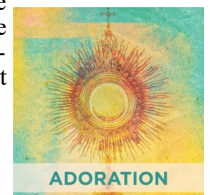
SEPTEMBER 1, 2024 TWENTY – SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Exposition of the Holy Eucharist, either in the ciborium or in the monstrance, is intended to acknowledge Christ's marvelous presence in the sacrament. Exposition invites us to the spiritual union with him that culminates in sacramental communion. Thus it fosters very well the worship which is due to Christ in spirit and in truth. Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass (HCWEOM), 82 "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Matthew 28:20b

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, As we continue the Eucharistic Revival, it is appropriate, I think, to reflect on the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. We Catholics believe in the enduring and eternal presence of our Lord in many ways, but most perfectly in the Eucharist, Christ's own Body and Blood given for our redemption. This presence is a sacramental expression of the promise Jesus made at the end of Matthew's Gospel, cited above. The Eucharist is reserved in the Tabernacle primarily to be used for viaticum, that is, one's last communion, given to the dying. The Eucharist, however, is also reserved for communion distribution in other circumstances, including to the sick, and also for worship. Worship of the Blessed Sacrament has been a long-standing Tradition of our Church. As we adore the Lord present in the monstrance, we are joined with him in a special way. It is important to note that when we worship our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, we are worshipping the same Lord who is sacramentally present when we receive Holy Communion. That is, adoration flows from the Eucharistic Liturgy, and it is the same Lord we worship in both liturgical actions. So, one isn't "better" than the other; we can do both things, and we should. Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the monstrance "extends the union with Christ which the faithful have reached in communion. It renews the covenant which in turn moves them to maintain in their lives what they have received by faith and by sacraments" (HCWEOM, 81). Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament is an opportunity to look at our Lord and let him look at us, as one of my seminary professors used to tell us. It is important that as we kneel or sit before the Blessed Sacrament, that we realize also that we must seek the presence of our Lord in other ways too. It's dishonest to kneel before the Blessed Sacrament if we then refuse to recognize Christ present in others and adore him in others as well. Our worship and reception of the Eucharist must always lead us in faith to serve others, to make Christ known in them, to be the face of Christ that may be the only Jesus other people ever see. So let us dedicate ourselves more fully to the Eucharist. **Let us receive the Eucharist in Holy Communion with fervor and devotion.** Let us worship the Lord in Holy Hour . And let us pray that our reception of the Eucharist at Mass and our adoration of the Blessed Sacrament may continue to be re-invigorated, and lead us all together, at last, to eternal life.

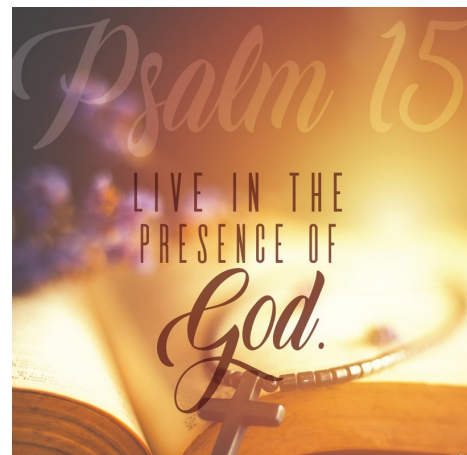

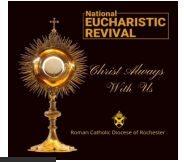
