It can be frustrating at times when, despite our best efforts to make a positive change in the world, our efforts do not seem to matter. It can often seem that when we try our best to be generous and do good in order to change the world for the better that our actions are fruitless. One might wearily say to their self, “I am only one person in the world, what difference can I make?”

In the Gospel today we are presented with a poor widow who leaves a meagre gift worth a couple of cents as a gift to the Temple treasury. It is presumed that this is all that she has, yet in spite of that she gives her gift to the Temple treasury. Surrounding her are those of wealth and plenty who are making a hypocritical show of their much larger gifts. Yet despite her small gift Jesus singles her out as the most generous of all.

This story is often explained as lesson of generosity, a condemnation of hypocrisy and duplicity, or a commentary on social justice, but I often see it as something else. I tend to see it portraying how a seemingly small act that means little in the grand scheme of things is actually something heroic and of immense value.

Jesus said of the widow’s offering that she had given more than anyone else because she had given all she had. She gave the most, even though it was only worth a few cents. In the grand scheme of things a few pennies did not mean much compared to the Temple treasure, but in that seeming small act the nameless widow was praised by our Lord for her generosity. Her courageous act shows how even the “little” things done out of love make a huge difference in the eyes of God.

So let us remember this widow when we wish we could give more but the stack of bills in the cabinet will not allow us. Let us think about her when we feel like our contributions to the goodness of the world do not matter. Let us take courage and always remember even one lone candle burning in the night is enough to hold back the darkness.

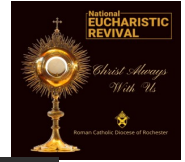

We are now accepting Nominations for the Hands of Christ Award for the Class of 2025. The Criteria for this award are the following: The Nominee has consistently demonstrated a Christian attitude, has been actively involved in the Parish, has been a positive role model to their peers, is a practicing Catholic and a high school senior. Forms will be available at all Churches and at the Parish Office. Completed forms are due back to the office by Thursday, November 21st.



Today's Gospel leads us to think about our family's financial contributions to our parish community, the diocese, other Church-sponsored organizations, and other charitable organizations. Good stewardship invites us to share our treasure as well as our time and talent. Sometimes, however, decisions about a family's charitable giving are made without our children's knowledge. Yet we teach more when we invite all family members to be aware of how we contribute to our Church and to other charitable organizations.

As you gather as a family, talk about your family's financial contributions to your parish and to other Church activities. If your family supports other charitable organizations, you might talk about these as well. Talk together about why it is important for us to share our resources with these organizations. Read today's Gospel, Mark 12:41-44. Talk about what Jesus observes about the generosity of the poor widow. Talk also about ways in which your family might also make a sacrificial gift to support your parish or other charitable organization. (Perhaps your family might choose not to go out to dinner but to contribute the money to your parish). Invite all family members to participate in the decision about what action you will take and which organization you will support with your contribution. Conclude in prayer together asking God to help your family be generous like the poor widow in today's Gospel. Pray together the Peace Prayer of St. Francis.



While often attributed to St. Francis of Assisi, the Peace Prayer wasn't written by the saint. However, it remains a popular traditional prayer.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.
