Dear Parishioners,

The veiling of statues and images of Christ during Passiontide (*Passiontide, the last two weeks of Lent focused on Christ's suffering, begins on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, April 6th, and continues through Holy Week, culminating in Easter on April 20th*) which is the two weeks before Easter is an ancient Catholic practice which seems puzzling at first sight. We have begun this practice of covering statues and crucifixes.

The custom of veiling crosses and images has much to commend it in terms of religious psychology, because it helps us to concentrate on the great essentials of Christ's work of Redemption. The historical origin of this practice lies elsewhere. It probably derives from a custom, noted in Germany from the ninth century, of extending a large cloth before the altar from the beginning of Lent. This cloth is called the "Hungertuch" (hunger cloth). Some authors say the practical reason for this practice was so the often-illiterate faithful had a way to know it was Lent. Others, maintain that it was a remnant of the ancient practice of public penance in which the penitents were ritually expelled from the church at the beginning of Lent. Prior to the revision of the Roman Missal (Sacramentary) in 1970, crosses and images were covered with veils during Passiontide which is the last two weeks of Lent, starting from the end of the Mass for Saturday of the Fourth Week of Lent. Since 1970, in the United States, the practice of veiling crosses and statues was not allowed since the USCCB had not voted on the issue. With the revision of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), the USCCB, in 2001, approved adaptations for the United States.

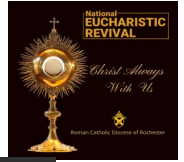
